5th BATTALION, 2d AIR DEFENSE ARTILLERY

Constituted 3 March 1847 in the Regular Army as Company M, 2d Regiment of Artillery

Organized 12 March 1847

Reorganized and redesignated 13 February 1901 as the 22d Company, Coast Artillery, Artillery Corps

Redesignated 2 February 1907 as the 22d Company, Coast Artillery Corps

Redesignated 6 July 1916 as the 1st Company, Fort Barrancas [Florida]

Redesignated 31 August 1917 as the 5th Company, Coast Defenses of Pensacola

Redesignated 1 June 1922 as the 22d Company, Coast Artillery Corps

Redesignated 1 July 1924 as Battery A, 2d Coast Artillery, and inactivated at Pensacola, Florida

Activated 1 September 1935 at Fort Monroe, Virginia

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1944 as Battery A, 2d Coast Artillery Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1945 as Battery A, Harbor Defenses of Chesapeake Bay

Inactivated 20 July 1946 at Fort Story, Virginia

Redesignated 28 June 1950 as Battery A, 2d Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion

Redesignated 27 February 1951 as Battery A, 2d Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion, an element of the 1st Armored Division

Activated 7 March 1951 at Fort Bliss, Texas

Consolidated 20 March 1951 with Battery A, 434th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion (see ANNEX), and consolidated unit designated as Battery A, 2d Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion

Redesignated 20 May 1953 as Battery A, 2d Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion

Inactivated 15 February 1957 at Fort Polk, Louisiana, and relieved from assignment to the 1st Armored Division

Redesignated 20 August 1958 as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 5th Automatic Weapons Battalion, 2d Artillery (organic elements concurrently constituted)

Activated 1 September 1958 in Germany

Inactivated 21 March 1960 in Germany

(Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 5th Automatic Weapons Battalion, 2d Artillery, consolidated 15 December 1961 with Battery A, 2d Field Artillery Battalion [organized in 1901], and consolidated unit designated as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 5th Automatic Weapons Battalion, 2d Artillery)

Redesignated 25 April 1966 as the 5th Battalion, 2d Artillery

Activated 1 June 1966 at Fort Bliss, Texas

Inactivated 23 June 1971 at Fort Lewis, Washington

Redesignated (less former Battery A, 2d Field Artillery Battalion) 1 September 1971 as the 5th Battalion, 2d Air Defense Artillery (former Battery A, 2d Field Artillery Battalion, concurrently redesignated as the 4th Battalion, 2d Field Artillery - hereafter separate lineage)
