**HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY
77TH QUARTERMASTER GROUP**

Constituted 17 February 1945 in the Army of the United States as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 77th Quartermaster Base Depot

Activated 5 March 1945 in Italy

Redesignated 29 January 1947 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 443d Quartermaster Base Depot, and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 24 February 1947 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Ordered into active military service 14 August 1950 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1954 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 443d Quartermaster Depot

Released from active military service 21 June 1955 and reverted to reserve status; concurrently inactivated at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Redesignated 24 November 1967 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 443d Field Depot

Activated 30 January 1968 at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Location changed 1 June 1968 to Leetsdale, Pennsylvania

Location changed 15 August 1975 to Oakdale, Pennsylvania

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 16 October 1985 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 443d Support Group

Inactivated 31 January 1994 at Oakdale, Pennsylvania

Converted and redesignated 31 May 2016 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company,
