2d BATTALION, 60th INFANTRY

Constituted 15 May 1917 in the Regular Army as Company B, 60th Infantry

Organized 10 June 1917 at Gettysburg National Park, Pennsylvania

(60th Infantry assigned 17 November 1917 to the 5th Division)

Inactivated 2 September 1921 at Camp Jackson, South Carolina

(60th Infantry relieved 15 August 1927 from assignment to the 5th Division and assigned to the 8th Division; relieved 1 October 1933 from assignment to the 8th Division and assigned to the 5th Division; relieved 16 October 1939 from assignment to the 5th Division; assigned 1 August 1940 to the 9th Division [later redesignated as the 9th Infantry Division])

Activated 10 August 1940 at Fort Bragg, North Carolina

Inactivated 30 November 1946 in Germany

Activated 15 July 1947 at Fort Dix, New Jersey

Inactivated 1 December 1957 in Germany and relieved from assignment to the 9th Infantry Division

Redesignated 12 February 1958 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2d Battle Group, 60th Infantry (organic elements concurrently constituted)

Battle Group assigned 15 February 1958 to the 2d Infantry Brigade and activated at Fort Devens, Massachusetts

Inactivated 19 February 1962 at Fort Devens, Massachusetts

Relieved 20 April 1962 from assignment to the 2d Infantry Brigade

2d BATTALION, 60th INFANTRY

Redesignated 1 February 1966 as the 2d Battalion, 60th Infantry; concurrently assigned to the 9th Infantry Division and activated at Fort Riley, Kansas

Inactivated 13 October 1970 at Fort Lewis, Washington

Activated 21 October 1972 at Fort Lewis, Washington

Inactivated 15 February 1991 at Fort Lewis, Washington, and relieved from assignment to the 9th Infantry Division

Headquarters transferred 15 April 1996 to the United States Army Training and Doctrine Command and activated at Fort Jackson, South Carolina
