## HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY 96th MILITARY POLICE BATTALION

Constituted 8 June 1945 in the Army of the United States as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 96th Military Police Battalion

Activated 13 June 1945 at Veules Les Roses, France

Inactivated 12 November 1945 at Charleroi, Belgium

Allotted 15 November 1950 to the Regular Army and activated in Seoul, Korea

Inactivated 20 March 1953 in Seoul, Korea

Activated 20 December 1965 at Fort Benning, Georgia

Inactivated 21 June 1974 at Oakland, California

Withdrawn 13 March 2003 from the Regular Army and allotted to the Army Reserve; concurrently redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 96th Military Police Battalion

Activated 16 March 2005 at San Diego, California

Ordered into active military service 5 August 2005 at San Diego; released from active military service 31 January 2007 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 15 May 2010 at San Diego; released from active military service 18 June 2011 and reverted to reserve status

Element ordered into active military service 12 June 2016 at San Diego; released from active military service 16 July 2017 and reverted to reserve status
