HEADQUARTERS AND SUPPORT COMPANY 3643d SUPPORT BATTALION

Organized 29 April 1878 in the New Hampshire Militia at Keene as Company H, 2d Infantry

(New Hampshire Militia redesignated 1 April 1879 as the New Hampshire National Guard)

Mustered into Federal service 11 May 1898 as Company L, 1st New Hampshire Volunteer Infantry

Mustered out of Federal service 31 October 1898 and resumed state status as Company H, 2d Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 20 January 1900 as Companies G and H, 1st Infantry

Mustered into Federal service 20 June 1916 at Keene; mustered out of Federal service 20 February 1917

Called into Federal service 25 July 1917 at Keene; drafted into Federal Service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 11 February 1918 as Companies G and H, First Army Headquarters Regiment

Demobilized 26 January 1919 at Camp Dix, New Jersey

Reorganized and redesignated 27 January 1922 as Battery G, 197th Artillery (Coast Artillery Corps)

HEADQUARTERS AND SUPPORT COMPANY 3643d SUPPORT BATTALION

Reorganized and redesignated 23 April 1924 as Battery G, 197th Coast Artillery

Inducted into Federal service 16 September 1940 at Keene

Reorganized and redesignated 15 May 1943 as Battery C, 210th Coast Artillery Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 15 June 1944 as Battery C, 210th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion

Inactivated 29 December 1945 at Camp Stoneman, California

Converted and Federally recognized 28 October 1947 in the New Hampshire Army National Guard at Keene as Headquarters Company, 3d Battalion, 195th Infantry

Converted and redesignated 1 December 1954 as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 574th Field Artillery Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1959 as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 4th Howitzer Battalion, 197th Artillery

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1963 as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 1st Howitzer Battalion, 197th Field Artillery

Consolidated 1 November 1964 with Battery C, 2d Howitzer Battalion, 172d Artillery (see ANNEX 1), and new unit designated Battery C, 2d Howitzer Battalion, 172d Artillery

Consolidated 1 December 1967 with Battery A, 2d Battalion, 172d Artillery (organized and Federally recognized 1 November 1965 at Keene), and new unit designated Battery C, 1st Battalion, 172d Artillery

Redesignated 1 May 1972 as Battery C, 1st Battalion, 172d Field Artillery

Converted and redesignated 1 September 1992 as Detachment 2, 744th Transportation Company

Location changed 1 November 1995 to Somersworth

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2008 as Company A, 3643d Support Battalion

HEADQUARTERS AND SUPPORT COMPANY 3643d SUPPORT BATTALION

Ordered into active Federal service 11 September 2010 at Somersworth; released from active Federal service 15 October 2011 and reverted to state control

Consolidated 1 September 2017 with Headquarters and Support Company, 3643d Support Battalion (see ANNEX 2) and Company B, 3643d Support Battalion (see ANNEX 3), and consolidated unit designated as the Headquarters and Support Company, 3643d Support Battalion; concurrently location changed to Portsmouth

Organized and Federally recognized 19 April 1948 in the New Hampshire Army National Guard at Keene as Company I, 195th Infantry

Converted and redesignated 1 December 1954 as Service Battery, 574th Field Artillery Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1959 as Battery A, 4th Howitzer Battalion, 172d Artillery

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1963 as Battery C, 2d Howitzer Battalion, 172d Artillery

ANNEX 2

Constituted 1 September 2008 in the New Hampshire Army National Guard as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 3643d Support Battalion

Organized and Federally recognized 25 March 2010 at Manchester

Ordered into active Federal service 18 September 2010 at Manchester; released from active Federal service 22 October 2011 and reverted to state control

ANNEX 3

Organized and Federally recognized 1 October 1997 in the New Hampshire Army National Guard at Concord as the 3643d Maintenance Company

Ordered into active Federal service 4 June and 4 July 2006 at Concord; released from active Federal service 30 December 2007 and reverted to state control

HEADQUARTERS AND SUPPORT COMPANY 3643d SUPPORT BATTALION

Converted and redesignated 1 September 2008 as Company B, 3643d Support Battalion, concurrently location changed to Manchester

Ordered into active Federal service 11 September 2010 at Manchester; released from active Federal service 22 October 2011 and reverted to state control
