Organized and Federally recognized 16 January 1947 in the Alabama Army National Guard at Fort Payne as Company C, 151st Engineer Combat Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 14 August 1950 at Fort Payne

(Company C, 151st Engineer Combat Battalion [NGUS], organized and Federally recognized 11 December 1952 at Fort Payne; reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1953 as Headquarters and Service Company, 151st Engineer Battalion)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1954 as Company C, 151st Engineer Battalion

Released from active Federal service 21 February 1955; concurrently consolidated with Headquarters and Service Company, 151st Engineer Battalion (NGUS), and consolidated unit designated as Headquarters and Service Company, 151st Engineer Battalion

Consolidated 1 April 1961 with the Medical Detachment, 151st Engineer Battalion (organized and Federally recognized 28 June 1954 at Valley Head) and consolidated unit reorganized and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 151st Engineer Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 11 June 1963 at Fort Payne; released 16 June 1963 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 10 September 1963 at Fort Payne; released 12 September 1963 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Consolidated 1 October 1997 with Detachment 1, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1343d Engineer Battalion (see ANNEX) and consolidated unit reorganized and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1343d Engineer Battalion

Converted and redesignated 1 September 2000 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 151st Chemical Battalion
