Peters- burg, Va.	80th Di- vision.	New Jersey, Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, and District of Columbia.	Lee.....	Robert E. Lee, General in Chief, C. S. A. Born in Virginia. Served in Mexican War and on frontier. Supt. U. S. M. A. 1852-1855. Commanded Ar- my of Northern Virginia from June 3, 1862, to Appomattox, Apr. 9, 1865. Last campaign was in vicinity of Petersburg.

Louisville, Ky.	84th Division.	Indiana and Kentucky.	Taylor..	Maj. Gen. Zachary Taylor, U. S. A. Born in Virginia. Appointed from Kentucky. Thanks of Congress for services in Mexican War. President of the United States 1849-50.
Battle Creek, Mich.	85th Division.	Michigan and Wisconsin.	Custer...	Maj. Gen. Geo. A. Custer, U. S. V. Born in Ohio. Commanded Michigan brigade in Civil War. Killed in command of 7th U. S. Cavalry, Little Big Horn, Mont., 1876.
Rockford, Ill.	86th Division.	Illinois.....	Grant...	Gen. U. S. Grant, U. S. A. Born in Ohio. Served in Mexican War. Col. 21st Ill. Inf. 1861. Commander in Chief, U. S. Army, 1864-1869. Thanks of Congress 1863. President of the United States 1869-1877.
Little Rock, Ark.	87th Division.	Arkansas, Louisiana, and Mississippi.	Pike....	Brig. Gen. Z. M. Pike, U. S. A. Born in New Jersey. Explorer of the Southwest. Visited Pike's Peak 1808. Killed Apr. 27, 1813, in attack on York, Canada.
Des Moines, Iowa.	88th Division.	Minnesota, Iowa, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota.	Dodge...	Maj. Gen. Grenville M. Dodge, U. S. V. Born in Massachusetts. Appointed from Iowa. Commanded Iowa Volunteers in Civil War. Chief engineer Union Pacific Railway and superintendent of its construction.
Fort Riley, Kans.	89th Division.	Kansas, Missouri, and Colorado.	Funston	Maj. Gen. Frederick Funston, U. S. A. Born in Ohio. Col. 20th Kansas U. S. V., Philippine Insurrection. Captured Aguinaldo. Brig. Gen. U. S. A. for this service. Died at San Antonio, Tex., 1917, while commanding troops, Mexican border.

Spartanburg, S. C.	27th (old 6th) Division.	New York....	Wadsworth.	Brig. Gen. J. S. Wadsworth, U. S. V. Born in New York. Bvt. Maj. Gen. Military Governor of Washington, 1862. Commanded division, Fredericksburg and Gettysburg. Killed during campaign of the Wilderness, May 6, 1864, when commanding a corps.
Augusta, Ga.	28th (old 7th) Division.	Pennsylvania.	Hancock	Maj. Gen. Winfield Scott Hancock, U. S. A. Born in Pennsylvania. Served in Mexican and Civil Wars. Thanks of Congress for Gettysburg and Spotsylvania campaigns. Nominated for Presidency in 1880.
Anniston, Ala.	29th (old 8th) Division.	New Jersey, Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, and District of Columbia.	McClellan.	Maj. Gen. G. B. McClellan, U. S. A. Served in Mexican War. Observer of Crimean War. Commander in Chief, U. S. Army, 1861-62. Nominated for President 1864. Governor of New Jersey, 1878-1881.
Greenville, S. C.	30th (old 9th) Division.	Tennessee, North Carolina, and South Carolina.	Savier...	Col. John Savier. Born in Virginia. North Carolina Militia, 1777-1781. Brig. Gen., U. S. A., 1798. Distinguished himself at Battle of Kings Mountain, N. C., 1780. Member of Congress from North Carolina and first governor of Tennessee.

Houston, Tex.	33d (old 12th) Division.	Illinois.....	Logan...	Maj. Gen. John A. Logan, U. S. V. Born in Illinois. Served in Mexican War. U. S. Senator from Illinois, 1871-1877 and 1879-1886.
Deming, N. Mex.	34th (old 13th) Division.	Minnesota, Iowa, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota.	Cody....	William F. Cody. Born in Iowa. 7th Kans. Cav. in Civil War. Chief of Scouts with U. S. Army, 1868-1872, and with Army at Wounded Knee, 1890. Member of Legislature of Nebraska, 1872. Died 1917.
Fort Sill, Okla.	35th (old 14th) Division.	Missouri and Kansas.	Doniphan.	Col. A. W. Doniphan, 1st Mo. Cav. Born in Kentucky. Commander of expedition to Chihuahua during the Mexican War.
Fort Worth, Tex.	36th (old 15th) Division.	Texas and Oklahoma.	Bowie...	James Bowie. Born in Georgia. Participated in revolution of Texas against Mexico. Col., 1835. Killed at the Alamo, 1836.
Montgomery, Ala.	37th (old 16th) Division.	Ohio and West Virginia.	Sheridan.	Gen. P. H. Sheridan, U. S. A. Born in New York. Brig. Gen., U. S. V., 1862. Maj. Gen., U. S. A., 1864. Distinguished especially for campaign in Shenandoah Valley. Commanded at Five Forks. Present at Appomattox Court House. Thanks of Congress, 1865. Commander in Chief of the Army, 1883-1888. Observer Franco-Prussian War.
Hattiesburg, Miss.	38th (old 17th) Division.	Indiana and Kentucky.	Shelby..	Col. Isaac Shelby, Va. Militia. Born in Maryland. Distinguished at King's Mountain, 1780, and South Carolina campaign, 1781. First governor of Kentucky, as which he received the thanks of Congress for the Battle of the Thames, 1813.
Alexandria, La.	39th (old 18th) Division.	Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas.	Beauregard.	Gen. P. G. T. Beauregard, C. S. A. Born in Louisiana. Distinguished in Mexican War in U. S. Army and Civil War in Confederate Army.

Palo Alto, Cal.	41st (old 20th) Division.	Washington, Oregon, Montana, Idaho, and Wyoming.	Fremont.	Maj. Gen. J. C. Fremont, U. S. A. Known as "The Pathfinder." Explorer of the West, 1842-1849. U. S. Senator from California, 1850-1851. Nominated for President, from California, 1856.
