IV._Citation for gallantry in action.—By direction of the President, under the provisions of the act of Congress approved July 9, 1918 (Bull. No. 43, W. D. 1918), the following-named enlisted man is cited for gallantry in action and is entitled to wear the Silver Star decoration. The citation is as follows:

Jerome Markey (Army serial No. 279760), formerly sergeant, Company E. 126th Infantry, 32d Division, American Expeditionary Forces. For gallantry in action during the operation on July 1, 1918, in the trenches near C. R. Gildwiller, Alsave, France. When it became practically impossible to reach the company command post because of violent bombardment of heavy artillery, Sergeant Markey, then private first class, voluntarily went forward alone through the harrage and succeeded in making a complete observation of the situation and reported same to his company commander, which information was of inestimable value. Residence at enlistment: Ann Arbor, Mich.

V_Award of life-saving medal.—Under the provisions of the act of Congress approved June 20, 1874, as amended by the act of Congress approved May 4, 1882, a silver life-saving medal was awarded by the Treasury Department to the following-named enlisted man:

* Riley E. Hopper (Army serial No. 15047912), private, Air Corps, Recruit Detachment, United States Army. In recognition of his service in bravely attempting to rescue a man from drowning on October 4, 1935, at Unelaska, Alaska.
