Constituted 6 March 1944 in the Army of the United States as the 264th Army Postal Unit

Activated 25 March 1944 at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey

Inactivated 19 April 1946 on Guam

Redesignated 5 June 1947 as the 350th Army Postal Unit and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 20 June 1947 at Texarkana, Arkansas

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 2 November 1949 at Texarkana, Arkansas

Activated 29 December 1954 at Heber Springs, Arkansas

Location changed 17 October 1960 to Searcy, Arkansas; on 14 February 1966 to Little Rock, Arkansas

Inactivated 15 March 1972 at Little Rock, Arkansas -

Redesignated 30 August 1994 as the 350th Adjutant General Company

Activated 16 October 1995 at Clinton, Oklahoma

Location changed 1 October 1999 to Grand Prairie, Texas

Elements ordered into active military service 2 January 2004 and 24 January 2004 at Grand Prairie, Texas; released from active military service 29 June 2005 and 21 July 2005 and reverted to reserve status

Reorganized and redesignated 16 October 2006 as the 350th Personnel Company

Ordered into active military service 21 February 2007 to 17 August 2007 and 18 April 2008 at Grand Prairie, Texas
