Reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1944 as the 58th Chemical General Service Company

Inactivated 31 March 1946 in Japan

Redesignated 28 March 1947 as the 307th Chemical General Service Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 12 April 1947 at Birmingham, Alabama

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 16 March 1949 at Birmingham, Alabama

Redesignated 14 April 1954 as the 307th Chemical Company

Activated 15 May 1954 at Charleston, South Carolina

Location changed 1 April 1957 to Greenville, South Carolina

Inactivated 15 June 1999 at Greenville, South Carolina
