Constituted 1 January 1943 in the Army of the United States as the 118th Chemical Impregnating Company

Activated 15 January 1943 at Camp Sibert, Alabama

Redesignated 20 September 1943 as the 118th Chemical Processing Company

Inactivated 25 January 1946 in the Philippines

Redesignated 11 July 1947 as the 334th Chemical Processing Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 5 August 1947 at Seattle, Washington

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Location changed 16 December 1948 to Fort Lawton, Washington; on 15 June 1950 to Seattle, Washington

Inactivated 20 January 1952 at Seattle, Washington

Redesignated 4 May 1956 as the 334th Chemical Company

Activated 1 July 1956 at Seattle, Washington

Inactivated 23 December 1965 at Seattle, Washington

Activated 16 September 2012 at Marysville, Washington


