Constituted 30 July 1942 in the Army of the United States as the 35th Chemical Decontamination Company

Activated 25 September 1942 at Camp Maxey, Texas

Inactivated 26 October 1945 at Fort Jackson, South Carolina

Redesignated 15 November 1948 as the 371st Chemical Decontamination Company and allotted to the Organized Reserve Corps

Activated 30 November 1948 at Niagara Falls, New York

Inactivated 31 October 1950 at Niagara Falls, New York

(Organized Reserve Corps redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Redesignated 16 September 1955 as the 371st Chemical Company

Activated 1 November 1955 at Rochester, New York

Inactivated 1 July 1959 at Rochester, New York

Activated 16 October 1984 at Greenwood, South Carolina

Ordered into active military service 20 September 1990 at Greenwood, South Carolina; released from active military service 5 May 1991 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 7 February 2003 at Greenwood, South Carolina;
released from active military service 6 February 2004 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 8 August 2012 at Greenwood, South Carolina;
