Inactivated 17 June 1946 in France

Redesignated 16 November 1948 as the 374th Chemical Depot Company and allotted to the Organized Reserve Corps

Activated 1 January 1949 at Maywood, California

(Organized Reserve Corps redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Location changed 10 July 1952 to Long Beach, California; on 1 September 1952 to Los Angeles, California

Inactivated 10 August 1953 at Los Angeles, California

Redesignated 5 November 1962 as the 374th Chemical Company

Activated 1 February 1963 at Bozeman, Montana

Location changed 1 October 1964 to Ogden, Utah; on 24 April 1972 to Sioux Falls, South Dakota


