Constituted 13 November 1945 in the Army of the United States as the 117th Military Government, Headquarters and Headquarters Company

Activated 21 December 1945 in Korea

Inactivated 31 May 1946 in Korea

Redesignated 7 December 1948 as the 405th Military Government Company and allotted to the Organized Reserve Corps

Activated 5 January 1949 at Anniston, Alabama

(Organized Reserve Corps redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Reorganized and redesignated 25 March 1955 as the 405th Military Government Group

Reorganized and redesignated 31 May 1957 as the 405th Civil Affairs and Military Government Group

Redesignated 1 December 1959 as the 405th Civil Affairs Group

Inactivated 30 September 1978 at Anniston, Alabama

Redesignated 16 September 1992 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 405th Civil Affairs Battalion

Redesignated 16 September 2005 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 405th Civil Affairs Battalion, and activated at Pleasant Grove, Utah (organic elements concurrently constituted and activated)
