413th CIVIL AFFAIRS BATTALION

Constituted 17 February 1949 in the Organized Reserve Corps as the 413th Military Government Company

Activated 25 February 1949 at Dallas, Texas

Inactivated 31 October 1950 at Dallas, Texas

Activated 15 January 1951 at Lubbock, Texas

(Organized Reserve Corps redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Reorganized and redesignated 15 October 1956 as the 413th Civil Affairs and Military Government Company

Redesignated 20 October 1959 as the 413th Civil Affairs Company

Company ordered into active military service 11 and 27 December 1990 at Lubbock, Texas; released from active military service 25 March and 23 April 1991 and reverted to reserve status

Company reorganized and redesignated 16 September 1992 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 413th Civil Affairs Battalion (organic elements concurrently constituted and activated)

Elements ordered into active military service 15-22 November 1996 at Lubbock, Texas; released from active military service 11-18 August 1996 and reverted to reserve status

413th CIVIL AFFAIRS BATTALION

Battalion ordered into active military service 28 February 2006 - 1 February 2007 at Lubbock, Texas; released from active military service 20 January 2007 - 24 April 2008 and reverted to reserve status

Elements ordered into active military service 19 August - 10 September 2008 at Lubbock, Texas
