Constituted 25 September 1950 in the Organized Reserve Corps as the 445th Military Government Company

Activated 15 October 1950 at Oakland, California

(Organized Reserve Corps redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Reorganized and redesignated 13 August 1956 as the 445th Civil Affairs and Military Government Company

Location changed 1 October 1957 to El Cerrito, California

Redesignated 10 December 1959 as the 445th Civil Affairs Company

Location changed 1 September 1961 to Oakland, California; changed 1 September 1962 to San Pablo, California; changed 1 March 1976 to Oakland, California

Reorganized and redesignated 16 September 1992 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 445th Civil Affairs Battalion (organic elements concurrently constituted and activated)

Location of battalion changed 1 April 1995 to Mountain View, California

Detachment B and additional elements ordered into active military service 30 August 2004 at Mountain View, California

(Detachments A and B reorganized and redesignated 16 September 2005 as Companies A and B)

445th CIVIL AFFAIRS BATTALION

Company B and additional elements released from active military service 17 April 2007 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 23 March and 28 August 2008 at Mountain View, California; released from active military service 26 April 2009 and 1 October 2009 and reverted to reserve status

Company D and additional elements ordered into active military service 15 September and 3 November 2011 at Mountain View, California; released from active military service 18 October and 6 December 2012 and reverted to reserve status
