**HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY
136th MANEUVER ENHANCEMENT BRIGADE**

Constituted 30 May 1917 in the Texas National Guard as the Supply Train, 15th Division

Organized 4 June 1917 with Headquarters at Houston and Motor Truck Companies at Dallas, Austin, Houston, and Big Springs; Headquarters Federally recognized 28 July 1917 at Houston

Drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Redesignated 20 August 1917 as the 117th Supply Train and assigned to the 42d Division

Demobilized 15 May 1919 at Camp Bowie, Texas

117th Supply Train and the 111th Supply Train (organized 2 October 1917 at Camp Bowie, Texas; demobilized 20 June 1919 at Camp Bowie, Texas) reconstituted, consolidated, reorganized, and redesignated as the 36th Division Train, with Headquarters Federally recognized 21 June 1927 at Austin

Reorganized and redesignated 9 April 1936 as the 111th Quartermaster Regiment, an element of the 36th Division

Inducted into Federal service 25 November 1940 at Austin

Reorganized and redesignated (less Headquarters of 1st, 2d, and 3d Battalions, and Companies A, B, and C - hereafter separate lineages) 1 February 1942 as the 111th Quartermaster Battalion, an element of the 36th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated (less Ordnance Maintenance Platoon - hereafter separate lineage) 1 November 1942 as the 36th Quartermaster Company, an element of the 36th Infantry Division

HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY 136th MANEUVER ENHANCEMENT BRIGADE

Inactivated 20 December 1945 at Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia

Reorganized and Federally recognized 10 January 1947 at Austin

Converted and redesignated 1 March 1963 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 111th Supply and Transport Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 15 February 1968 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 111th Transportation Group, and relieved from assignment to the 36th Infantry Division

Consolidated 1 November 1971 with the 49th Transportation Detachment (constituted 7 December 1967 in the Texas Army National Guard and Federally recognized 15 December 1967 at Del Valle), and consolidated unit designated as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 111th Transportation Group

Location changed 1 October 1972 to Del Valle

Consolidated 1 April 1975 with the 122d Transportation Company (see ANNEX) and consolidated unit converted and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 111th Support Group

Location changed 1 September 1977 to Austin

Ordered into active Federal service 18 July 1997 at Austin; released from active Federal service 13 April 1998 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 25 June 2005 at Austin; released from active Federal service 23 July 2006 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2008 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 136th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade

Location changed 1 September 2011 to Round Rock

Ordered into active Federal service 3 August 2012 at Round Rock; released from active Federal service 8 July 2013 and reverted to state control

ANNEX

Constituted 9 December 1942 in the Army of the United States as the 295th Quartermaster Salvage Repair Company

HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY 136th MANEUVER ENHANCEMENT BRIGADE

Activated 30 December 1942 at Camp Sutton, North Carolina

Inactivated 30 November 1946 in Germany

Consolidated 1 December 1946 with the 4307th Quartermaster Salvage Repair Company (organized and Federally recognized 15 November 1946 in the Texas National Guard at Austin) and consolidated unit designated as the 4307th Quartermaster Salvage Repair Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1949 as the Supply Company, 249th Quartermaster Battalion, an element of the 49th Armored Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1953 as Company A, 249th Armored Quartermaster Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 16 March 1959 as Company A, 249th Quartermaster Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 15 October 1961 at Austin; released from active Federal service 9 August 1962 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1963 as Company A, 249th Supply and Transport Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1964 as Company A, 49th Supply and Transport Battalion

Location changed 1 September 1966 to Del Valle

Reorganized and redesignated 15 December 1967 as the 122d Transportation Company and relieved from assignment to the 49th Armored Division

Redesignated 1 February 1970 as the 1386th Transportation Company

Redesignated 1 November 1971 as the 122d Transportation Company; location concurrently changed to Pasadena


