## Lineage and Honors

### **HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY 141st MANEUVER ENHANCEMENT BRIGADE**

Organized 14 September 1883 in the Dakota Militia at Bismarck as Company A

Redesignated 13 January 1885 as Company A, 1st Regiment, Dakota Militia

(Territory of Dakota divided into states of North and South Dakota pursuant to enabling Act of Congress, 22 February 1889, effected by Proclamation of the President, 2 November 1889; organized militia of North Dakota redesignated 6 March 1891 as the North Dakota National Guard)

Redesignated 2 November 1889 as Company A, 1st Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 20 May 1898 at Camp Briggs, North Dakota, as Company A, 1st North Dakota Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 25 September 1899 at the Presidio of San Francisco, California

Reorganized in November 1899 in the North Dakota National Guard at Bismarck as Company A, 1st Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 1 July 1916; mustered out of Federal service 14 February 1917 at Fort Snelling, Minnesota

Drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 4 October 1917 as Company A, 164th Infantry, an element of the 41st Division

Demobilized 28 February 1919 at Camp Dix, New Jersey

## **HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY 141st MANEUVER ENHANCEMENT BRIGADE**

Reorganized and Federally recognized 16 May 1923 in the North Dakota National Guard at Bismarck as Company A, 164th Infantry, an element of the 34th Division

Inducted into Federal service 10 February 1941 at Bismarck

(164th Infantry relieved 8 December 1941 from assignment to the 34th Division; assigned 24 May 1942 to the Americal Division)

Inactivated 24 November 1945 at Fort Lawton, Washington

(164th Infantry relieved 10 June 1946 from assignment to the Americal Division and assigned to the 47th Infantry Division)

Reorganized and Federally recognized 29 August 1947 at Bismarck

Ordered into active Federal service 16 January 1951 at Bismarck (Headquarters Company, 164th Infantry [NGUS], organized and Federally recognized 16 January 1953 at Bismarck)

Released 2 December 1954 from active Federal service and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Headquarters Company, 164th Infantry (NGUS)

Converted and redesignated 15 April 1955 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 164th Engineer Group, and relieved from assignment to the 47th Infantry Division

Ordered into active Federal service 15 October 1961 at Bismarck; released 9 August 1962 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1998 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, Engineer Brigade, 34th Infantry Division

Ordered into active Federal service 22 March 2007 at Bismarck

Consolidated 1 September 2008 with and Headquarters Company, 142d Engineer Battalion (see ANNEX), and consolidated unit designated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 141st Maneuver Enhancement Brigade

Released from active Federal service 16 September 2008 and reverted to state control

Constituted 18 September 1940 in the North Dakota National Guard as Battery E, 188th Field Artillery

Organized and Federally recognized 18 October 1940 at Fargo

Inducted into Federal service 1 April 1941 at Fargo

Reorganized and redesignated 8 February 1943 as Battery B, 957th Field Artillery Battalion

Inactivated 31 October 1945 at Camp Myles Standish, Massachusetts

Reorganized and Federally recognized 19 June 1947 at Fargo as Headquarters Company (part), 47th Infantry Division

Ordered into active Federal service 22 January 1951 at Fargo; released from active Federal service 2 December 1954 and reverted to state control

Converted and redesignated 15 April 1955 as Headquarters Company, 957th Infantry Battalion

Converted and redesignated 1 March 1956 as Headquarters Battery, 957th Field Artillery Battalion

Converted and redesignated 1 April 1959 as Headquarters Company, 188th Engineer Group

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1968 as the 188th Engineer Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1972 as the 816th Engineer Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1985 as Headquarters Company, 142d Engineer Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 24 January 2003 at Fargo; released from active Federal service 23 January 2004 and reverted to state control
