Lineage and Honors

1035th ENGINEER DETACHMENT

Organized 27 June 1810 in the Massachusetts Militia at Norway, District of Maine, as a company of infantry

Mustered into Federal service 14 September 1814 at Norway; mustered out of Federal service 24 September 1814

Reorganized in 1820 in the Maine Militia as a company of infantry

Redesignated 15 September 1855 as the Norway Light Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated in 1860 as Co H, 1st Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 3 May 1861 at Portland as Company G, 1st Infantry Regiment, Maine Volunteers; mustered out of Federal service 5 August 1861 at Portland

Reorganized 28 September 1861 as Company G, 10th Maine Volunteer Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 3 October 1861 at Cape Elizabeth; mustered out of Federal service 8 May 1863 in Virginia

Reorganized and redesignated 11 December 1863 as Company G, 29th Infantry Regiment, Maine Volunteers

Mustered into Federal service 17 December 1863 at Augusta; mustered out of Federal service 21 June 1866 at Hilton Head, South Carolina

Reorganized 18 September 1869 in the Maine Volunteer Militia at Norway as a separate infantry company

1035th ENGINEER DETACHMENT

Reorganized and redesignated 5 April 1873 as Company D, 1st Infantry Regiment

(Maine Volunteer Militia redesignated 28 March 1893 as the Maine National Guard)

Mustered into Federal service 10-26 May 1898 at Augusta as Company D, 1st Maine Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 25 October-13 December 1898 and resumed state status

Redesignated 16 June 1908 as Company D, 2d Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 28 June 1916 at Augusta; mustered out of Federal service 25 October 1916 at Augusta

Called into Federal service 13 April 1917; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 21 August 1917 as Company D, 103d Infantry, an element of the 26th Division

Demobilized 28 April 1919 at Camp Devens, Massachusetts

Reorganized and Federally recognized 26 May 1921 in the Maine National Guard at Norway as Company C, 3d Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 January 1922 as Company C, 103d Infantry, an element of the 43d Division (later redesignated as the 43d Infantry Division)

Inducted into Federal service 24 February 1941 at Norway

Inactivated 1 November 1945 at Camp Stoneman, California

(103d Infantry relieved 21 May 1946 from assignment to the 43d Infantry Division)

Reorganized and Federally recognized 18 April 1947 in the Maine National Guard at Norway as Company H, 103d Infantry

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 March 1959 as the Howitzer Battery, 2d Reconnaissance Squadron, 103d Armored Cavalry

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 June 1961 as Company C, 3d Medium Tank Battalion, 20th Armor

1035th ENGINEER DETACHMENT

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1964 as Company C, 2d Battalion, 20th Armor

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 31 December 1967 as the 2d General Construction Platoon, Company D, 133d Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 June 1968 as Company D, 262d Engineer Battalion

Consolidated 1 March 1984 with Detachment 1, Company D, 262d Engineer Battalion at Rumford (see ANNEX) and consolidated unit designated as Company D, 262d Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1993 as Detachment 1, Company C, 133d Engineer Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 7 December 2003 at Norway; released from active Federal service 3 June 2005 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2008 as the 1035th Engineer Detachment; location concurrently changed to Gardiner

ANNEX

Organized 22 April 1908 in the Maine National Guard at Rumford as a company of infantry

Designated 16 June 1908 as Company B, 2d Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 28 June 1916 at Augusta; mustered out of Federal service 25 October 1916 at Augusta

Called into Federal service 13 April 1917; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 21 August 1917 as Company B, 103d Infantry, an element of the 26th Division

Demobilized 28 April 1919 at Camp Devens, Massachusetts

Reorganized and Federally recognized 2 August 1920 in the Maine National Guard at Rumford as Company A, 3d Infantry

Redesignated 1 March 1921 as Company B, 3d Infantry

1035th ENGINEER DETACHMENT

Reorganized and redesignated 1 January 1922 as Company B, 103d Infantry, an element of the 43d Division (later redesignated as the 43d Infantry Division)

Inducted into Federal service 24 February 1941 at Rumford

Inactivated 1 November 1945 at Camp Stoneman, California

(103d Infantry relieved 21 May 1946 from assignment to the 43d Infantry Division)

Reorganized and Federally recognized 14 November 1947 in the Maine National Guard at Rumford as Company K, 103d Infantry

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 March 1959 as Troop K, 3d Reconnaissance Squadron, 103d Armored Cavalry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 June 1961 as Company B, 3d Medium Tank Battalion, 20th Armor

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1964 as Company B, 2d Battalion, 20th Armor

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 31 December 1967 as the 2d General Construction Platoon, Company C, 133d Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 June 1968 as the 2d and 3d Platoons, Company D, 262d Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1972 as Detachment 1, Company D, 262d Engineer Battalion


