### **1221ST ENGINEER COMPANY**

Organized and Federally recognized 14 November 1936 in the South Carolina National Guard at Warrenton as Company B, 105th Quartermaster Battalion

Inducted into Federal service 16 September 1940 at Warrenton

Reorganized and redesignated 7 February 1942 as the 2d Platoon, Company A, 105th Quartermaster Battalion, an element of the 30th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 27 September 1942 as the 30th Quartermaster Company, an element of the 30th Infantry Division

Inactivated 17 November 1945 at Fort Jackson, South Carolina

Reorganized and Federally recognized 31 August 1948 in the South Carolina National Guard as Company C, 122d Engineer Battalion, an element of the 51st Infantry Division at Warrenton

Relieved from assignment to the 51st Infantry Division 1 April 1963

Location changed 1 February 1976 to Graniteville

Ordered into active Federal service 10 February 2003 at Graniteville; released from active Federal service 15 June 2004 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2008 as the 1221st Engineer Company

Ordered into active Federal service 6 July 2010 at Graniteville; released from active Federal service 9 August 2011 and reverted to state control

Consolidated 2 September 2015 with the 715th Engineer Detachment (Organized and Federally recognized 26 March 2009 at Newberry, location changed 1 April 2013 to Eastover), 716th Engineer Detachment (see ANNEX 2), 717th Engineer Detachment (see ANNEX 3), 718th Engineer Detachment (Organized and Federally recognized 26 March 2009 at Newberry, location changed 1 April 2013 to Eastover) and consolidated unit designated as the 1221st Engineer Company

Ordered into active Federal service 3 January 2019 at Graniteville; released from active Federal service 2 January 2020 and reverted to state control

Consolidated 31 August 2025 with the 1220th Engineer Platoon (organized and Federally recognized 7 November 2012 at Batesburg) and consolidated unit designated as the 1221st Engineer Company

Ordered into active Federal service 22 October 2025 at Graniteville

Reorganized and redesignated 1 January 1968 as Company D, 122d Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 15 September 1993 as Company B, 122d Engineer Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 10 February 2003 at Batesburg; released from active Federal service 15 June 2004 and reverted to state control

Consolidated 1 September 2004 with Detachment 1, Company B, 122d Engineer Battalion (organized and Federally recognized 1 August 1998 at Eastover) and consolidated unit designated as Company B, 122d Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2008 as Detachment 1, 1221st Engineer Company
