1222d ENGINEER COMPANY (TOM HALL GUARDS)

Organized 27 May 1901 in the South Carolina National Guard at Fort Mill as Company K, 1st Infantry

Redesignated 1 April 1915 as Company G, 1st Infantry

Mustered into Federal service 3 July 1916 at Fort Mill; mustered out of Federal service 6 December 1916

Called into Federal service 12 April 1917; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 12 September 1917 as Company G, 118th Infantry and assigned to the 30th Division

Demobilized 1 April 1919 at Camp Jackson, South Carolina

Reorganized and Federally recognized 16 September 1920 as Company K, 118th Infantry, an element of the 30th Division

Inducted into Federal service 16 September 1940 at Fort Mill

(118th Infantry relieved 24 August 1942 from assignment to the 30th Division)

Inactivated 24 December 1945 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey

Reorganized and Federally recognized 20 February 1947 at Fort Mill as Company H, 218th Infantry

Converted and redesignated 1 April 1959 as Troop B, 2d Reconnaissance Squadron, 263d Armor

1222d ENGINEER COMPANY (TOM HALL GUARDS)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1963 as Company B, 2d Battalion, 263d Armor

Converted and redesignated 1 October 1995 as Company B, 178th Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2008 as the 1222d Engineer Company

Ordered into active Federal service 7 November 2009 at Fort Mill; released from active Federal service 11 December 2010 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 1 October 2020 at Fort Mill; released from active Federal service 14 December 2021 and reverted to state control
