**126th ENGINEER COMPANY**

Organized and Federally recognized 26 April 1929 in the Idaho National Guard at Moscow as Troop K, 116th Cavalry, an element of the 24th Cavalry Division

Converted and redesignated 12 September 1940 as Battery F, 148th Field Artillery, an element of the 41st Division

Inducted into Federal service 16 September 1940 at Moscow

Reorganized and redesignated 17 February 1942 as Battery C, 205th Field Artillery Battalion, an element of the 41st Infantry Division

Inactivated 31 December 1945 in Japan

(205th Field Artillery Battalion relieved 17 June 1946 from assignment to the 41st Infantry Division)

Reorganized and Federally recognized 14 May 1948 at Moscow as Company B, 200th Tank Battalion

Converted and redesignated 12 September 1949 as Battery B, 148th Field Artillery Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 1 May 1951 at Moscow

(Battery B, 148th Field Artillery Battalion [NGUS], organized and Federally recognized 4 August 1953 at Moscow)

Released 18 March 1955 from active Federal service and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Battery B, 148th Field Artillery Battalion (NGUS)

## 126th ENGINEER COMPANY

Reorganized and redesignated 15 March 1956 as Battery B, 148th Armored Field Artillery Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1959 as Battery B, 1st Howitzer Battalion, 148th Artillery

Converted and redesignated 1 January 1968 as the 2d Dump Truck Platoon, 129th Engineer Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 December 1971 as the 127th Engineer Company  
Consolidated 1 February 1977 with the 938th Engineer Platoon (organized and Federally recognized 1 January 1968 at Moscow) and consolidated unit redesignated as Company B, 116th Engineer Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 28 June 2004 at Moscow; released from active Federal service 24 December 2005 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2006 as the 126th Engineer Company
