2120th ENGINEER COMPANY

Organized and Federally recognized 22 May 1925 in the Oklahoma National Guard at Tahlequah as Company M, 180th Infantry and assigned to the 45th Division

Inducted into active Federal service 16 September 1940 at Tahlequah

(45th Division redesignated 11 February 1942 as the 45th Infantry Division)

Inactivated 29 November 1945 at Camp Bowie, Texas

Redesignated 20 September 1946 as Company M, 279th Infantry

Reorganized and Federally recognized 14 January 1947 at Tahlequah

Ordered into active Federal service 1 September 1950 at Tahlequah

(Company M, 279th Infantry [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 30 October 1952 at Tahlequah)

Released 30 April 1954 from active Federal service and reverted to state control; concurrently, Federal recognition withdrawn from Company M, 279th Infantry (NGUS)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1959 as Company A, 1st Battle Group, 279th Infantry, an element of the 45th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1963 as Company A, 1st Battalion, 279th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1965 as Company A, 2d Battalion, 179th Infantry

Converted and redesignated 1 February 1968 as Company A, 120th Engineer Battalion

2120th ENGINEER COMPANY

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1980 as Company D, 120th Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 June 1989 as Company A, 120th Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 August 1993 as Detachment 3, HSC, 120th Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1996 as Company A, 120th Engineer Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 7 December 2003 at Tahlequah; released from active Federal service 3 June 2005 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2008 as the 2120th Engineer Company

Location changed 1 July 2011 to Broken Arrow

Ordered into active Federal service 5 June 2017 at Broken Arrow; released from active Federal service 2 June 2018 and reverted to state control

Consolidated 8 May 2018 with Detachment 1, 2120th Engineer Company (see ANNEX), and consolidated unit designated as the 2120th Engineer Company

Organized and Federally recognized 4 May 1949 in the Oklahoma National Guard at Henryetta as the Service Company, 279th Infantry Regiment

Ordered into active Federal service 1 September 1950 at Henryetta

(Service Company, 279th Infantry [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 30 October 1952 at Henryetta)

Released 30 April 1954 from active Federal service and reverted to state control; concurrently, Federal recognition withdrawn from the Service Company, 279th Infantry (NGUS)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1959 as the Support and Maintenance Platoon, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1st Battle Group, 180th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 30 September 1962 as 2d Rifle Platoon, Company D, 1st Battle Group, 180th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1963 as the 2d Rifle Platoon, Company B, 2d Battalion, 279th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1964 as the 2d Platoon & Weapons Platoon, Company B, 2d Battalion, 279th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1965 as Company B, 1st Battalion, 180th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1968 as the Supply and Equipment Section, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 120th Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 December 1971 as Detachment 1, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 120th Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1980 as Detachment 1, Company C, 120th Engineer Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 7 December 2003 at Henryetta; released from active Federal service 3 June 2005 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2008 as Detachment 1, 2120th Engineer Company

Ordered into active Federal service 5 June 2017 at Henryetta; released from active Federal service 2 June 2018 and reverted to state control
