Constituted 1 April 1927 in the Organized Reserves as the 734th Engineer Shop Company

Organized in 1927 at Boston, Massachusetts

Location changed 8 April 1929 to Worcester, Massachusetts; on 12 May 1931 to Boston, Massachusetts

Redesignated 20 August 1931 as the 734th Engineer Company

Location changed 7 April 1936 to Providence, Rhode Island; on 9 November 1937 to Roanoke, Virginia; on 22 April 1938 to Richmond, Virginia

Redesignated 7 May 1942 as the 734th Engineer Heavy Shop Company

Ordered into active military service 15 February 1943 at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana

Inactivated 25 June 1946 in France

Redesignated 9 September 1947 as the 338th Engineer Heavy Shop Company

Activated 20 September 1947 at Boston, Massachusetts

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1950 as the 338th Engineer Base Maintenance Company

Reorganized and redesignated 5 March 1952 as the 338th Engineer Heavy Shop Company

Reorganized and redesignated 13 March 1953 as the 338th Engineer Company

Inactivated 1 April 1954 at Boston, Massachusetts

Activated 11 May 1959 at Pittsfield, Massachusetts

Inactivated 31 January 1968 at Pittsfield, Massachusetts

Activated 16 September 2008 at Attleboro, Massachusetts


