## 341st ENGINEER COMPANY

Constituted 9 March 1944 in the Army of the United States as the 1383d Engineer Petroleum Distribution Company

Activated 25 March 1944 at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana

Inactivated 15 December 1946 in Japan

Redesignated 5 August 1947 as the 341st Engineer Panel Bridge Transport Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 19 August 1947 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Reorganized and redesignated 28 July 1949 as the 341st Engineer Panel Bridge Company

Ordered into active military service 19 August 1950 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1954 as the 341st Engineer Company

Released from active military service 3 December 1954 and reverted to reserve status

Inactivated 20 July 1955 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Activated 1 December 1955 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Inactivated 15 March 1958 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Activated 30 January 1968 at New Kensington, Pennsylvania

Inactivated 15 March 1972 at New Kensington, Pennsylvania

Activated 16 September 2005 at Barling, Arkansas

Ordered into active military service 21 May 2008 at Barling, Arkansas; released from active military service 24 June 2009 and reverted to reserve status
