**387th ENGINEER COMPANY**

Constituted 19 December 1942 in the Army of the United States as the 612th Engineer Light Equipment Company

Activated 19 February 1943 at Fort Jackson, South Carolina

Inactivated 30 November 1945 at Camp Shelby, Mississippi

Redesignated 2 May 1947 as the 387th Engineer Light Equipment Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 16 May 1947 at Roswell, New Mexico

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 9 January 1950 at Roswell, New Mexico

Redesignated 12 August 1953 as the 387th Engineer Pipeline Company

Activated 12 September 1953 at Hobbs, New Mexico

Redesignated 14 December 1953 as the 387th Engineer Company

Location changed 1 April 1954 to Las Vegas, New Mexico; on 22 January 1958 to Farmington, New Mexico; on 1 April 1959 to Las Vegas, New Mexico; on 11 July 1960 to Farmington, New Mexico; on 1 March 1963 to Las Vegas, New Mexico; on 1 November 1964 to Santa Fe, New Mexico; on 1 January 1966 to Albuquerque, New Mexico

Ordered into active military service 16 September 1990 at Albuquerque, New Mexico; released from active military service 3 May 1991 and reverted to reserve status

Inactivated 15 September 2006 at Albuquerque, New Mexico

Activated 16 September 2009 at Phoenix, Arizona

Location changed 30 September 2011 to Scottsdale, Arizona

Ordered into active military service 11 March 2018 at Scottsdale, Arizona; released from active military service 10 March 2019 and reverted to reserve status

Location changed 15 March 2021 to Glendale, Arizona


