## **388th ENGINEER COMPANY**

Constituted 29 May 1943 in the Army of the United States as the 709th Engineer Petroleum Distribution Company

Activated 26 July 1943 at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana

Inactivated 4 January 1946 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey

Redesignated 10 April 1947 as the 388th Engineer Petroleum Distribution Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 28 April 1947 at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; on 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 9 July 1949 at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

Activated 21 July 1949 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Ordered into active military service 19 August 1950 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Reorganized and redesignated 29 August 1951 as the 388th Engineer Pipeline Company

Reorganized and redesignated 27 March 1954 as the 388th Engineer Company

Released from active military service 25 April 1955 and reverted to reserve status

Inactivated 20 July 1955 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Activated 16 October 2010 at West Palm Beach, Florida

Ordered into active military service 5 November 2013 at West Palm Beach, Florida; released from active military service 9 December 2014 and reverted to reserve status

Location changed 14 December 2015 to Lake Park, Florida

Ordered into active military service 12 October 2023 at Lake Park, Florida
