Constituted 15 October 1921 in the Organized Reserves as the 537th Engineer Bridge Train

Organized in January 1922 at New York, New York

Location changed 17 March 1923 to Hamburg, New York

Reorganized and redesignated 5 September 1928 as the 537th Engineer Ponton Company

Location changed 11 October 1928 to Buffalo, New York; on 15 April 1937 to New York, New York

Reorganized and redesignated 16 June 1942 as the 537th Engineer Light Ponton Company

Ordered into active military service at New York, New York, and reorganized 25 June 1943 at Camp Howze, Texas

Inactivated 12 October 1945 at Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia

Redesignated 5 February 1947 as the 401st Engineer Light Ponton Company

Redesignated 26 February 1947 as the 401st Engineer Ponton Bridge Company

Activated 12 March 1947 at Springfield, Massachusetts

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)
