Activated 15 July 1942 at Camp Gruber, Oklahoma

Inactivated 31 October 1945 in Schwetzingen, Germany

Redesignated 11 April 1947 as the 461st Engineer Petroleum Distribution Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 28 April 1947 at Lawrence, Kansas

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Location changed 19 April 1948 to Kansas City, Kansas; on 5 April 1949 to Manhattan, Kansas

Inactivated 19 September 1950 at Manhattan, Kansas

Activated 27 February 1951 at York, Nebraska

Reorganized and redesignated 15 April 1952 as the 461st Engineer Pipeline Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1954 as the 461st Engineer Company

Inactivated 14 September 1954 at York, Nebraska

Activated 11 January 1956 at Casper, Wyoming
