Constituted 5 May 1943 in the Army of the United States as the 1229th Engineer Fire Fighting Platoon

Activated 5 August 1943 at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana

Inactivated 30 October 1945 at Camp Shanks, New York

Redesignated 11 March 1947 as the 763d Engineer Service Platoon

Activated 21 April 1947 at Shemya, Alaska

Inactivated 23 August 1948 at Shemya, Alaska

Redesignated 23 February 1954 as the 763d Engineer Detachment and allotted to the Regular Army

Activated 1 April 1954 at Yongsan, Korea

Inactivated 20 January 1955 at Yongsan, Korea

Activated 24 June 1958 at Vicenza, Italy

Inactivated 25 June 1959 at Vicenza, Italy

Activated 25 June 1960 at Fort Hood, Texas

Inactivated 1 January 1966 at Pyong-Teak, Korea

Activated 1 December 1966 at Fort George G. Meade, Maryland

Inactivated 23 August 1968 at Qui Nhon, Vietnam

Withdrawn 3 May 2004 from the Regular Army and allotted to the Army Reserve

Activated 16 September 2006 at Fort Jackson, South Carolina

released from active military service 5 April 2009 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 26 May 2015 at Fort Jackson, South Carolina;
released from active military service 28 June 2016 and reverted to reserve status
