Lineage and Honors

947th ENGINEER BATTALION

Constituted 13 July 1942 in the Army of the United States as Company D, 66th Medical Regiment

Activated 20 August 1942 at Camp Barkeley, Texas

Reorganized and redesignated 11 September 1943 as the 613th Clearing Company

Inactivated 19 October 1945 at Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia

Redesignated 10 May 1946 as the 947th Clearing Company and allotted to the Colorado National Guard

Organized and Federally recognized 3 March 1948 at Denver

Ordered into active Federal service 11 September 1950 at Denver

Reorganized and redesignated 18 December 1950 as the 947th Medical Clearing Company, Separate

Reorganized and redesignated 11 May 1953 as the 947th Medical Company

Released from active Federal service 10 February 1955 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 1 October 1961 at Denver; released from active Federal service 9 August 1962 and reverted to state control

Redesignated 1 March 1963 as the 928th Medical Company

Consolidated 1 April 1963 with Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 217th Medical Battalion (organized and Federally recognized 1 October 1947 at Denver) and consolidated unit designated as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 217th Medical Battalion

Location changed 1 April 1966 to Aurora; on 1 October 1989 to Pueblo

947th ENGINEER BATTALION

Ordered into active Federal service 29 November 1990 at Pueblo; released from active Federal service 10 May 1991 and reverted to state control

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 September 1997 as the 947th Engineer Company

Location changed 1 September 2003 to Colorado Springs

Ordered into active Federal service 7 September 2005 at Colorado Springs; released from active Federal service 5 March 2007 and reverted to state control
