

DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY Lineage and Honors

148th INFANTRY REGIMENT (SIXTH OHIO)

Organized from Companies in South-Central Ohio as the 2d Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry and mustered into Federal service 23 June 1846 at Camp Washington, Ohio; mustered out of Federal service 23 June 1847 at New Orleans, Louisiana

Reorganized and mustered into Federal service 1 September 1847 at Camp Wool, Ohio; mustered out of Federal service 26 July 1848 at Cincinnati

Reorganized 1855-1861 as independent companies in Ohio

Consolidated in April 1861 and reorganized at Camp Jackson, Ohio as the 3d and 4th Regiments, Ohio Volunteer Infantry

Mustered into Federal service 27 April and 2 May 1861, respectively, for three months; reorganized and mustered into Federal service 12 June and 05 June 1861, respectively at Camp Dennison, Ohio

3d Regiment mustered out of Federal service 23 June 1864 at Cincinnati; 4th Regiment reorganized in September 1864 as the 4th Battalion, Ohio Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 12 July 1865 at Jeffersonville, Indiana

Reorganized 1870-1877 as independent companies in southern and south-central Ohio

Companies consolidated in 1876-1877 and reorganized in the Ohio National Guard as the 5th, 6th and 14th Infantry Regiments

Reorganized 27 July 1878 as the 6th and 14th Infantry Regiments

6th and 14th Infantry Regiments consolidated 14 June 1890 and consolidated unit designated as the 14th Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 9 May 1898 at Camp Bushnell, Ohio as the 4th Ohio Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 20 January 1899 at Columbus

Disbanded 14 April 1899

Reorganized 14 July 1899 in the Ohio National Guard as the 4th Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 11 July 1916 at Camp Willis, Ohio; mustered out of Federal service 3 March 1917 at Fort Wayne, Michigan

Called into Federal service 15 July 1917

Drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 20 August 1917 as the 166th Infantry, and assigned to the 42d Division

Demobilized 17 May 1919 at Camp Sherman, Ohio

Elements of the former 4th Infantry Regiment consolidated with elements of the former 7th Infantry Regiment (see ANNEX 1) and reorganized 21 May 1920 in the Ohio National Guard as the 4th Infantry, with Headquarters federally recognized at Columbus

Redesignated 1 July 1921 as the 166th Infantry, an element of the 37th Division

Inducted into Federal service 15 October 1940 at home stations

Relieved 1 February 1942 from assignment to the 37th Division

Regiment (less 2d and 3d Battalions) inactivated 1 February 1944 at Fort Sill, Oklahoma (2d Battalion inactivated 22 February 1944 at Camp Hood, Texas; 3d Battalion inactivated 12 February 1945 at Fort Sill, Oklahoma)

166th Infantry reorganized and Federally recognized 11 November 1946 in the Ohio National Guard with Headquarters at Columbus

Reorganized 1 September 1959 as a parent Regiment under the Combat Arms Regimental System, to consist of the 1st Battle Group, an element of the 37th Infantry Division

Reorganized 1 April 1963 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 37th Infantry Division

Reorganized 15 February 1968 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 38th Infantry Division

Reorganized 1 March 1977 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 73d Infantry Brigade

Withdrawn 1 May 1989 from the Combat Arms Regimental System and reorganized under the United States Army Regimental System

Consolidated 1 September 1992 with the 148th Infantry (see ANNEX 2); consolidated unit designated as the 148th Infantry to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 73d Infantry Brigade (Later redesignated as the 37th Infantry Brigade); concurrently, location of Headquarters changed to Lima

Reorganized 1 September 1993 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 28th Infantry Division

Reorganized 1 September 1994 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 38th Infantry Division

Ordered into active Federal service 6-15 October 2001 at home stations; released from active Federal service 5-14 October 2002 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 5 July 2004 at home stations

Redesignated 1 October 2005 as the 148th Infantry Regiment, to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 38th Infantry Division

Released from active Federal service 1 November 2005 and reverted to state control

Reorganized 1 September 2007 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 37th Infantry Brigade Combat Team; concurrently, location of Headquarters changed to Walbridge

Ordered into active Federal service 2 January 2008 at home stations; released from active Federal service 9 January 2009 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 11 September – 15 October 2011 at home stations; released from active Federal service 14 October – 17 November 2012 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 9 January 2017 at home stations; released from active Federal service 12 February 2018 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 23 September 2022 at home stations; released from active Federal service 28 October 2023 and reverted to state control

ANNEX 1

Organized 25 October 1877 in the Ohio National Guard from independent companies in Southern and Southeastern Ohio as the 17th Infantry Regiment with Headquarters at Zanesville

Mustered into Federal service 13-30 May 1898 at Camp Bushnell, Ohio, as the 7th Ohio Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 6 November 1898 at Columbus

Disbanded 14 April 1899

Reorganized 6 November 1899 as the 7th Separate Battalion with Headquarters in Ironton

Expanded and redesignated 20 June 1901 as the 7th Infantry Regiment

Called into Federal service 15 July 1917

Drafted into Federal Service 5 August 1917

Regiment broken up 15 September 1917 and its elements reorganized and redesignated as units in the 37th Division; 37th Division demobilized 23 June 1919 at Camp Sherman, Ohio

ANNEX 2

Organized 14 September 1877 in the Ohio National Guard from existing units in Northwestern Ohio as the 16th Infantry Regiment, with Headquarters at Toledo

Mustered into Federal service 12 May-2 July 1898 at Camp Bushnell, Ohio as the 6th Ohio Volunteer Infantry; mustered out 12 May 1899 at Camp Mackenzie, Georgia

Redesignated 20 September 1899 as the 6th Infantry Regimen

Mustered into Federal service 19 June 1916 at Camp Willis, Ohio

Drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 25 September 1917 as the 147th Infantry, an element of the 37th Division

Consolidated 25 October 1917 with the 1st Infantry Regiment, Ohio National Guard; consolidated unit designated as the 147th Infantry

Demobilized 19 April 1919 at Camp Sherman, Ohio

Elements of the former 6th Infantry Regiment consolidated with elements of the former 2d Infantry Regiment (see ANNEX 3); and consolidated unit reorganized 1919-1920 in the Ohio National Guard as the 2d Infantry Regiment; Headquarters federally recognized 23 March 1921 at Toledo

Redesignated 1 July 1921 as the 148th Infantry, and element of the 37th Division

(Location of headquarters changed 1 December 1937 to Columbus)

Inducted into Federal service 15 October 1940 at home stations

(37th Division redesignated 1 February 1942 as the 37th Infantry Division)

Inactivated 5-18 December 1945, by elements at Camp Anza, California

Reorganized and federally recognized 20 November 1946 in the Ohio National Guard with Headquarters at Toledo

Ordered into active military service 15 January 1952 at home stations

(148th Infantry [NGUS] organized and federally recognized 15 January 1954 with Headquarters in Toledo)

148th Infantry released from active military service 15 June 1954 and reverted to State control; concurrently, Federal recognition withdrawn from 148th Infantry (NGUS)

Reorganized 1 September 1959 as the 148th Infantry, a parent Regiment under the Combat Arms Regimental System, to consist of the 1st and 2d Battle Groups, elements of the 37th Infantry Division

Reorganized 1 April 1963 to consist of the 1st and 2d Battalions, 148th Infantry, elements of the 37th Infantry Division

Reorganized 15 February 1968 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 38th Infantry Division; concurrently, location of Headquarters changed to Lima

Reorganized 1 March 1977 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 73d Infantry Brigade

Withdrawn 1 May 1989 from the Combat Arms Regimental System and reorganized under the United States Army Regimental System

ANNEX 3

Organized 6 July 1876 in the Ohio National Guard from independent companies in west-central Ohio as the 11th Infantry Regiment, with Headquarters in Findlay

Reorganized and redesignated 1 June 1883 as the 2d Infantry Regiment; concurrently, location of Headquarters changed to Kenton

Mustered into Federal service 10 May 1898 at Camp Bushnell, Ohio, as the 2d Ohio Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 10 February 1899 at Macon, Georgia

Disbanded 14 April 1899

Reorganized 13 November 1899 in the Ohio National Guard as the 2d Infantry Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 19 June 1916 at Camp Willis, Ohio; mustered out of Federal service 24 March 1917 at Fort Sheridan, Illinois

Called into Federal service 15 July 1917; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Regiment broken up 15 September 1917 and its elements reorganized and redesignated as units in the 37th Division; 37th Division demobilized 23 June 1919 at Camp Sherman, Ohio
