# 466th MEDICAL COMPANY

Organized 6 November 1876 in the New York National Guard at Glens Falls as the 5th Separate Company, 10th Brigade

Redesignated 8 December 1877 as the 18th Separate Company

Redesignated 21 March 1898 as the 18th Company, 14th Battalion

Redesignated 27 April 1898 as Company K, 2d New York Volunteer Infantry

Mustered into Federal service 16 May 1898 at Camp Black, New York; mustered out of Federal service 29 October 1898 at Glens Falls

Reorganized 19 November 1898 in the New York National Guard at Glens Falls as Company K, 2d Infantry Regiment

Called into Federal service 18 June 1916

Mustered into Federal service 1 July 1916 at Glens Falls; mustered out of Federal service 8 October 1916 at Glens Falls

Mustered into Federal service 30 March 1917 at Glens Falls; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1917 as Company K, 105th Infantry, an element of the 27th Division

Demobilized 1 April 1919 at Camp Upton, New York

Consolidated with Company K, 2d Infantry, New York Guard (organized 27 August 1917 at Glens Falls to replace company in Federal service), and consolidated unit reorganized and Federally recognized 14 January 1920 in the New York National Guard at Glens Falls as Company K, 2d Infantry

Redesignated 1 June 1921 as Company K, 105th Infantry

(105th Infantry assigned 17 November 1921 to the 27th Division)

Inducted into Federal service 15 October 1940 at Glens Falls

(Headquarters, 27th Division reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1942 as Headquarters, 27th Infantry Division)

Inactivated 31 December 1945 at Fort Lawton, Washington

Reorganized and Federally recognized 22 April 1947 in the New York National Guard at Glens Falls as Company K, 105th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1953 as Headquarters Company, 3d Battalion, 105th Infantry

Converted and redesignated 1 February 1955 as Headquarters Battery, 186th Field Artillery Battalion and relieved from assignment to the 27th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1955 as Headquarters Battery, 186th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, an element of the 27th Armored Division

Reorganized and redesignated 16 March 1959 as Headquarters Battery, 1st Howitzer Battalion, 186th Artillery, an element of the 27th Armored Division

(1st Howitzer Battalion, 186th Artillery relieved 15 April 1953 from assignment to the 27th Armored Division)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1964 as Headquarters Battery, 1st Battalion, 186th Artillery

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1966 as Headquarters Battery, 1st Howitzer Battalion, 186th Artillery

Converted and redesignated 1 February 1968 as the 646th Medical Company

Converted and redesignated 1 October 1996 as Detachment 1, Company C, 427th Support Battalion

Consolidated 1 November 2001 with Company C, 427th Support Battalion (see ANNEX), and consolidated unit designated as Company C, 427th Support Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2005 in the New York Army National Guard as the 466th Medical Company

Ordered into active Federal service 1 July 2006 at Glens Falls; released from active Federal service 27 December 2007 and reverted to state control

Location changed 1 August 2009 to Queensbury

Ordered into active Federal service 30 July 2020 at Queensbury; released from active Federal service 2 September 2021 and reverted to state control

Organized 12 March 1878 in the New York National Guard at Saratoga Springs as the 22d Separate Company

Redesignated 21 March 1898 as the 22d Company, 14th Battalion

Redesignated 27 April 1898 as Company L, 2d New York Volunteer Infantry

Mustered into Federal service 16 May 1898 at Camp Black, New York; mustered out of Federal service 27 October 1898 at Saratoga Springs

Reorganized 19 November 1898 in the New York National Guard at Saratoga Springs as Company L, 2d Infantry Regiment

Called into Federal service 18 June 1916

Mustered into Federal service 1 July 1916 • at Saratoga Springs; mustered out of Federal service 16 October 1916 at Saratoga Springs

Mustered into Federal service 30 March 1917 at Saratoga Springs; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1917 as Company L, 105th Infantry, an element of the 27th Division

Demobilized 1 April 1919 at Camp Upton, New York

Consolidated with Company L, 2d Infantry, New York Guard (organized 16 November 1917 at Saratoga Springs to replace company in Federal service), and consolidated unit reorganized and Federally recognized 14 January 1920 in the New York National Guard at Saratoga Springs as Company L, 2d Infantry

Redesignated 1 June 1921 as Company L, 105th Infantry

(105th Infantry assigned 17 November 1921 to the 27th Division)

Inducted into Federal service 15 October 1940 at Saratoga Springs

(Headquarters, 27th Division redesignated 1 September 1942 as Headquarters, 27th Infantry Division)

Inactivated 31 December 1945 at Fort Lawton, Washington

Reorganized and Federally recognized 24 April 1947 in the New York National Guard at Saratoga Springs as Company L, 105th Infantry

Converted and redesignated 1 February 1955 as Company B, 27th Armored Quartermaster Battalion, an element of the 27th Armored Division

Reorganized and redesignated 16 March 1959 as Company B, 27th Quartermaster Battalion, an element of the 27th Armored Division

Reorganized and redesignated 15 April 1963 as Company B, 27th Supply and Transport Battalion, an element of the 27th Armored Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 June 1964 as Company A, 27th Supply and Transport Battalion

Converted and redesignated 1 February 1968 as the 247th Medical Company and relieved from assignment to the 27th Armored Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1994 as Company C, 427th Support Battalion
