1103d MILITARY POLICE DETACHMENT

Organized and Federally recognized 5 July 1932 in the Kentucky National Guard at Harrodsburg as the 38th Tank Company and assigned to the 38th Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1940 as Company D, 192d Tank Battalion, and relieved from assignment to the 38th Division

Inducted into Federal service 25 November 1940 at Harrodsburg

Surrendered 9 April 1942 to the Japanese forces on the Bataan Peninsula, Philippine Islands

Inactivated 2 April 1946 in the Philippine Islands

Converted and redesignated 13 May 1946 as the Service Battery, 441st Field Artillery Battalion

Reorganized and Federally recognized 8 August 1947 at Harrodsburg

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1959 as the Service Battery, 3d Howitzer Battalion, 138th Artillery

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 March 1968 as the 203d General Supply Company

Consolidated 1 September 1978 with the 413th Maintenance Company (see ANNEX) and consolidated unit designated as the 413th Maintenance Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1980 as Company D, 103d Support Battalion, an element of the 149th Armored Brigade

1103d MILITARY POLICE DETACHMENT

Reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1985 as Company B, 3d Support Battalion, 35th Infantry Division Support Command

Redesignated 1 June 1987 as Company B, 103d Support Battalion, an element of the 35th Infantry Division

(103d Support Battalion relieved from assignment to the 35th Infantry Division 1 September 1994 and assigned to the 38th Infantry Division)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1995 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 103d Support Battalion

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 30 September 2002 as the 1103d Military Police Detachment

Ordered into active Federal service 3 January 2004 at Louisville; released from active Federal service 30 June 2005 and reverted to state control

ANNEX

Constituted 13 May 1946 in the Kentucky National Guard as the 413th Ordnance Tank Maintenance Company

Organized and Federally recognized 14 November 1947 at Louisville

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1950 as the 413th Ordnance Heavy Maintenance Company

Ordered into active Federal service 3 September 1950 at Louisville

(413th Ordnance Heavy Maintenance Company [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 3 September 1952 at Louisville; redesignated 1 October 1953 as the 413th Ordnance Company [NGUS])

Reorganized and redesignated 16 February 1953 as the 413th Ordnance Company

Released from active Federal service 5 January 1955 and reverted to state control; concurrently, Federal recognition withdrawn from the 413th Ordnance Company (NGUS)

Location changed 7 April 1958 to Frankfort

Ordered into active Federal service 4 October 1961 at Frankfort; released from active Federal service 11 August 1962 and reverted to state control
