Constituted 3 April 1943 in the Army of the United States as the Military Police Platoon, Americal Division

Activated 1 May 1943 in the Fiji Islands

Inactivated 2 December 1945 at Fort Lawton, Washington

Redesignated 1 December 1954 as the 23d Military Police Company and allotted to the Regular Army (Americal Division concurrently redesignated as the 23d Infantry Division)

Activated 2 December 1954 at Fort Amador, Panama Canal Zone

Inactivated 10 April 1956 at Fort Amador, Panama Canal Zone

Activated 8 December 1967 at Chu Lai, Vietnam

Inactivated 28 June 1972 at Chu Lai, Vietnam and relieved from assignment to the 23d Infantry Division

Activated 18 October 2005 at Fort Bragg, North Carolina
