301st MILITARY POLICE COMPANY

Constituted 6 January 1942 in the Army of the United States as the 301st Prisoner of War Escort Company

Activated 15 January 1942 at Camp Upton, New York

Redesignated 1 April 1942 as the 301st Military Police Escort Guard Company

Inactivated 21 November 1945 at Camp Myles Standish, Massachusetts

Allotted 12 November 1946 to the Organized Reserves

Activated 20 November 1946 at Canon City, Colorado

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1952 as the 301st Military Police Company

Inactivated 15 January 1972 at Omaha, Nebraska

Activated 1 May 1975 at Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico

Location changed 16 September 1980 to Bayamon, Puerto Rico

Ordered into active military service 7 January 1991 at Bayamon, Puerto Rico; released from active military service 22 September 1991 and reverted to reserve status

Location changed 31 March 1994 to Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico

Ordered into active military service 1 October 2001 at Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico;
released from active military service 30 September 2002 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 4 January 2004 at Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico;
released from active military service 14 March 2005 and reverted to reserve status
