302d MILITARY POLICE COMPANY

Constituted 6 January 1942 in the Army of the United States as the 302d Prisoner of War Escort Company

Activated 10 February 1942 at Camp Upton, New York

Converted and redesignated 7 May 1942 as the 302d Military Police Escort Guard Company

Inactivated 15 December 1945 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey

Redesignated 2 January 1947 as the 302d Military Police Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 20 October 1947 at Santa Fe, New Mexico

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; on 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 29 November 1950 at Santa Fe, New Mexico

Activated 16 April 1981 at Fort Worth, Texas

Ordered into active military service 24 June 1996 at Fort Worth, Texas; released from active military service 20 March 1997 and reverted to reserve status

Location changed 1 October 1999 to Grand Prairie, Texas

Ordered into active military service 16 January 2003 at Grand Prairie, Texas; released from active military service 30 April 2004 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 25 June 2008 at Grand Prairie, Texas; released from active military service 29 July 2009 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 30 November 2013 at Grand Prairie, Texas; released from active military service 3 January 2015 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 13 August 2019 at Grand Prairie, Texas; released from active military service 14 November 2020 and reverted to reserve status
