# **46th MILITARY POLICE COMPANY**

Organized 28 October 1891 in the Michigan State Troops at Owosso as Company G, 3d Infantry

(Michigan State Troops redesignated 31 December 1894 as the Michigan National Guard)

Mustered into Federal service in May 1898 as Company G, 3d Michigan Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 18 December 1898 at Detroit

Reorganized 10 July 1899 in the Michigan National Guard at Owosso as Company H, 3d Infantry

Redesignated 22 April 1915 as Company H, 33d Infantry

Mustered into Federal service 19 June 1916; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 19 September 1917 as Company M, 125th Infantry, an element of the 32d Division

Demobilized 22 May 1919 at Camp Custer, Michigan

Reorganized and Federally recognized 6 January 1922 in the Michigan National Guard at Owosso as Company G, 125th Infantry, an element of the 32d Division

Inducted into Federal service 15 October 1940 at Owosso

(125th Infantry relieved 8 December 1941 from assignment to the 32d Division)

Inactivated 20 September 1945 at Camp Rucker, Alabama

Reorganized and Federally recognized 7 December 1946 at Owosso as Company I, 125th Infantry, an element of the 46th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 15 March 1959 as the Combat Support Company, 1st Battle Group, 125th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 15 June 1959 as Company E, 1st Battle Group, 125th Infantry

Redesignated 15 March 1963 as Company B, 2d Battalion, 125th Infantry

Ordered into active Federal service 14 July 1967 at Camp Grayling, Michigan; released 2 August 1967 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Converted and redesignated 1 February 1968 as the 144th Military Police Company and relieved from assignment to the 46th Infantry Division

Ordered into active Federal service 2 August 1980 at Owosso; released 16 August 1980 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 3 December 1990 at Owosso; released 26 April 1991 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Consolidated 1 September 1992 with Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 146th Military Police Battalion (see ANNEX 1) and consolidated unit designated as the 144th Military Police Company

Ordered into active Federal service 14 March 2002 at Owosso; released from active Federal service 13 March 2003 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 25 July 2006 at Owosso; released from active Federal service 18 January 2008 and reverted to state control; concurrently, location changed to Corunna

Ordered into active Federal service 15 March 2013 at Corunna; released from active Federal service 18 April 2014 and reverted to state control

Consolidated 1 July 2016 with 46th Military Police Company (see ANNEX 2) and consolidated unit designated as the 46th Military Police Company

Ordered into active Federal service 31 March 2019 at Corunna; released from active Federal service 29 March 2020 and reverted to state control

#### ANNEX 1

Constituted 13 February 1959 in the Michigan Army National Guard as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 46th Infantry Division Trains

Organized and Federally recognized 15 March 1959 at Grand Rapids

Location changed 14 March 1961 to Lansing

Reorganized and redesignated 15 March 1963 as Headquarters, Headquarters Company, and Band (less Band), 46th Infantry Division Support Command

Ordered into active Federal service 14 July 1967 at Camp Grayling, Michigan; released 2 August 1967 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Converted and redesignated 1 February 1968 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 146th Military Police Battalion, and relieved from assignment to the 46th Infantry Division

Ordered into active Federal service 2 August 1980 at Lansing; released 16 August 1980 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Location changed 1 April 1985 to Owosso

Ordered into active Federal service 12 January 1991 at Owosso; released 6 June 1991 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

#### ANNEX 2

Constituted 22 May 1946 in the Michigan National Guard as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 593d Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion

Organized and Federally recognized 1 November 1949 at Kingsford

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1950 as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 300th Antiaircraft Artillery Gun Battalion

Redesignated 5 October 1953 as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 300th Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion

Consolidated 15 March 1959 with the 384th Ordnance Detachment (organized and Federally recognized 7 December 1953 at Kingsford ) and Medical Detachment, 300th Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion (Federally recognized 18 December 1950 at Kingsford ); and consolidated unit reorganized and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters and Service Battery, 3d Howitzer Battalion, 182d Artillery, an element of the 46th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 15 March 1963 as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 3d Battalion, 182d Artillery

Ordered into active Federal service 24 July 1967 at Camp Grayling, Michigan; released 2 August 1967 from active Federal service and reverted to state control

Converted and redesignated 1 February 1968 as Company D, 107th Engineer Battalion, and relieved from assignment to the 46th Infantry Division

Converted and redesignated 1 October 1995 as the 46th Military Police Company

Ordered into active Federal service 25 November 2001, released from active Federal service 4 March to 19 April 2002 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 9 July 2006 at Kingsford

Consolidated 1 September 2007 with Detachment 1, 46th Military Police Company (organized and Federally recognized 30 September 1978 at Menominee), and consolidated unit designated as the 46th Military Police Company; concurrently, location changed to Cheboygan

Released from active Federal service 4 January 2008 and reverted to state control
