Allotted 27 September 1951 to the Regular Army

Activated 28 October 1951 at Pusan, Korea

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1953 as the 552d Military Police Company

Inactivated 25 April 1954 at Taegu, Korea

Activated 20 June 1961 at Landes de Bussac, France

Inactivated 28 April 1972 at Long Binh, Vietnam

Activated 1 October 1976 at Camp Hialeah, Pusan, Korea
