88th MILITARY POLICE COMPANY

Constituted 24 June 1921 in the Organized Reserves as the 88th Military Police Company and assigned to the 88th Division

Organized in 1921 in Minneapolis, Minnesota

Redesignated 30 January 1942 as the Military Police Platoon, Headquarters and Military Police Company, 88th Division

Redesignated 1 April 1942 as the Military Police Platoon, 88th Division

(88th Division redesignated 1 August 1942 as the 88th Infantry Division)

Ordered into active military service 15 July 1942 at Fort Gruber, Oklahoma

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1947 as the 88th Military Police Platoon and relieved from assignment to the 88th Infantry Division

Inactivated 29 September 1947 at Trieste, Italy

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; on 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Redesignated 14 May 1955 as the 88th Military Police Company

Activated 16 October 1984 at Hampton, Virginia

Location changed 15 September 1993 to Fort Eustis, Virginia

Ordered into active military service 10 February 2003 at Fort Eustis, Virginia; released from active military service 9 February 2004 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 17 August 2009 at Fort Eustis, Virginia; released from active military service 20 September 2010 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 8 February 2015 at Fort Eustis, Virginia; released from active military service 13 March 2016 and reverted to reserve status
