1120th MAINTENANCE COMPANY

Organized and Federally recognized 31 August 1918 in the Oklahoma National Guard at Tishomingo as Company C, 3d Infantry

Redesignated 2 June 1921 as Company L, 3d Infantry

Redesignated 14 October 1921 as Company L, 180th Infantry, an element of the 45th Division (later redesignated as the 45th Infantry Division)

Reorganized and redesignated 31 December 1921 as Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 180th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1940 as Headquarters Detachment, 1st Battalion, 180th Infantry

Inducted into Federal service 16 September 1940 at Tishomingo

Reorganized and redesignated 30 June 1942 as Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 180th Infantry

Inactivated 24 November 1945 at Camp Bowie, Texas

Reorganized and Federally recognized 3 October 1946 in the Oklahoma National Guard at Tishomingo as the 45th Cavalry Reconnaissance Troop, Mechanized, an element of the 45th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 December 1948 as the 45th Reconnaissance Company

1 120th MAINTENANCE COMPANY

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 February 1949 as Company H, 180th Infantry, an element of the 45th Infantry Division

Ordered into active Federal service 1 September 1950 at Tishomingo

(Company H, 180th Infantry [NGUS], organized and Federally recognized 20 November 1952 at Tishomingo)

Released from active Federal service 30 April 1954 and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Company H, 180th Infantry (NGUS)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1959 as Company E, 1st Battle Group, 180th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 30 September 1962 as the 2d Rifle and Weapons Platoon, Company B, 1st Battle Group, 180th Infantry

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 April 1963 as Company A, 2d Battalion, 245th Armor, an element of the 45th Infantry Division

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 February 1968 as the 1245th Transportation Company and relieved from assignment to the 45th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1975 as Detachment 1, 1345th Transportation Company

Redesignated 1 May 1976 as Detachment 1, 1245th Transportation Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1982 as the 1245th Transportation Company

Reorganized and redesignated 6 September 1992 as Detachment 1, 1245th Transportation Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1996 as Detachment 1, 1120th Maintenance Company

Consolidated 1 September 2001 with Detachment 2, 1120th Maintenance Company (organized and Federally recognized 16 November 1946 at Sulphur); consolidated unit designated as Detachment 1, 1120th Maintenance Company and location concurrently changed to Sulphur

1120th MAINTENANCE COMPANY

Consolidated 1 March 2007 with the 1120th Maintenance Company (see ANNEX), and consolidated unit designated as the 1120th Maintenance Company; location concurrently changed to Ada

Ordered into active Federal service 19 October 2007 at Ada; released from active Federal service 21 November 2008 and reverted to state control

ANNEX

Organized and Federally recognized 8 May 1923 in the Oklahoma National Guard at Sulphur as Headquarters Battery, 158th Field Artillery, an element of the 45th Division (later redesignated as the 45th Infantry Division)

Inducted into Federal service 16 September 1940 at Sulphur

Disbanded 11 February 1942

Reconstituted 25 August 1945 in the Oklahoma National Guard at Sulphur

Converted, reorganized and Federally recognized 3 October 1946 as the Cannon Company, 180th Infantry, an element of the 45th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1948 as the Heavy Mortar Company, 180th Infantry

Ordered into active Federal service 1 September 1950 at Sulphur

(Heavy Mortar Company, 180th Infantry [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 21 October 1952 at Sulphur)

Heavy Mortar Company, 180th Infantry released from active Federal service 30 April 1954 and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from the Heavy Mortar Company, 180th Infantry (NGUS)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1959 as the Combat Support Company (less Reconnaissance Platoon at Ada), 1st Battle Group, 180th Infantry, an element of the 45th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 30 September 1962 as the Combat Support Company, 1st Battle Group, 180th Infantry

1120th MAINTENANCE COMPANY

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 April 1963 as Company B, 120th Supply and Transport Battalion, an element of the 45th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1968 as the 1145th Transportation Company

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 December 1971 as the 1120th Maintenance Company

Location changed 1 August 1999 to Ada

Consolidated 1 September 2001 with Detachment 1, 1120th Maintenance Company (organized and Federally recognized 7 March 2000 at Konawa), and consolidated unit designated as the 1120th Maintenance Company


