Inactivated 13 January 1922 at Camp Bragg, North Carolina

Assigned 24 March 1923 to the 2d Cavalry Division; relieved 15 August 1927 from assignment to the 2d Cavalry Division

Assigned 18 August 1933 to the 6th Division; relieved 16 October 1939 from assignment to the 6th Division

Activated 10 February 1941 at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland

Reorganized and redesignated 10 April 1943 as the 13th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Company

Inactivated 20 June 1948 in Germany

Redesignated 11 July 1949 as the 13th Ordnance Artillery and Vehicle Park Company and activated at Fort Lewis, Washington

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1954 as the 13th Ordnance Company

Inactivated 24 June 1955 in Korea

Activated 21 March 1957 at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama

Inactivated 15 December 1994 at Fort Bliss, Texas

Activated 16 October 1999 at Fort Bliss, Texas
