115th MAINTENANCE COMPANY

Organized and Federally recognized 28 April 1939 in the Utah National Guard at Ogden as the 115th Ordnance Company, an element of the 40th Division

Inducted into Federal service 3 March 1941 at Ogden

Relieved 5 February 1942 from assignment to the 40th Division (later redesignated as the 40th Infantry Division)

Reorganized and redesignated 19 July 1943 as the 115th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Company

Inactivated 12 December 1945 at Fort Lewis

Reorganized and Federally recognized 9 January 1947 in the Utah Army National Guard at Fort Douglas as the 115th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Company

Reorganized and redesignated 15 September 1952 as the 115th Ordnance Company

Ordered into active Federal service 15 October 1961 at Fort Douglas; released from active Federal service 14 August 1962 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 1 December 1967 as the 115th Heavy Equipment Maintenance Company

Location changed 1 September 1971 to Riverton; on 1 January 1989 to Draper

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1978 as the 115th Maintenance Company

Ordered into active Federal service 28 January 2005 at Draper; released from active Federal service 26 July 2006 and reverted to state control
