1st MAINTENANCE COMPANY

Organized 12 January 1918 in France as the 1st Mobile Ordnance Repair Shop, an element of the 1st Division

Disbanded 27 September 1919

Reconstituted 28 January 1927 in the Regular Army as the 1st Mobile Ordnance Repair Shop and concurrently consolidated with the 1st Ordnance Company (see ANNEX); consolidated unit designated as the 1st Ordnance Company, an element of the 1st Division

Relieved 11 October 1939 from assignment to the 1st Division

Redesignated 1 April 1942 as the 1st Ordnance Medium Maintenance Company

Inactivated 15 February 1946 at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri

Activated 30 June 1947 at Fort Bliss, Texas

Reorganized and redesignated 25 January 1953 as the 1st Ordnance Company

Inactivated 20 December 1966 at Fort Sill, Oklahoma

Activated 25 January 1968 at Fort Carson, Colorado

Inactivated 13 May 1968 at Fort Carson, Colorado

Redesignated 21 December 1972 as the 1st Maintenance Company and activated at Fort Riley, Kansas

Organized 7 September 1919 in the Regular Army at Pig Point, Virginia, as the 9th Light Mobile Ordnance Repair Shop

Assigned 8 May 1920 to the 1st Division

Redesignated 3 June 1920 as the 1st Light Mobile Ordnance Repair Shop

Redesignated 15 February 1921 as the 1st Ordnance Company
