Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 29 March 1921 as Company A, 4th Motor Repair Battalion, and allotted to the Regular Army

Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1936 as Company A, 1st Battalion, 53d Quartermaster Regiment

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 18 August 1942 as Company A, 1st Battalion, 53d Ordnance Heavy Maintenance Regiment (Q)

Reorganized and redesignated 30 September 1942 as the 313th Ordnance Motor Transport Company

Reorganized and redesignated 4 October 1943 as the 313th Ordnance Depot Company

Inactivated 10 January 1946 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey

Redesignated 3 January 1947 as the 23d Ordnance Depot Company

Redesignated 25 March 1947 as the 23d Ordnance Service Company

Activated 1 May 1947 in Italy

Reorganized and redesignated 20 August 1951 as the 23d Ordnance Maintenance Company
