**3622d MAINTENANCE COMPANY**

Organized 7 September 1916 in the Pennsylvania National Guard while in Federal service at El Paso, Texas, from personnel of the 4th Infantry as the Machine Gun Company, 4th Infantry

Mustered out of Federal service 17 January 1917 at Lancaster

Mustered into Federal service 20 July 1917 at Lancaster; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 11 October 1917 as Company A, 109th Machine Gun Battalion, an element of the 28th Division

Demobilized 4 May 1919 at Camp Dix, New Jersey, and relieved from assignment to the 28th Division

Reorganized, redesignated, and Federally recognized 7 August 1920 in the Pennsylvania National Guard at Lancaster as Company A, 2d Separate Battalion, Infantry

Converted and redesignated 1 May 1922 as Battery E, 213th Artillery (Antiaircraft)

Redesignated 1 August 1924 as Battery E, 213th Coast Artillery

Inducted into Federal service 16 September 1940 at Lancaster

Reorganized and redesignated 14 March 1944 as Battery A, 899th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion

Inactivated 13 February 1945 in France

## **3622d MAINTENANCE COMPANY**

Reorganized and Federally recognized 2 May and 17 December 1947 at Lancaster as Batteries A and B, 899th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion (Battery A - hereafter separate lineage)

Ordered into active Federal service 5 September 1950 at Lancaster (Battery B, 899th Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion [NGUS], organized and Federally recognized 13 July 1953 at Lancaster)

Redesignated 1 April 1953 as Battery B, 899th Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion

Released 15 June 1954 from active Federal service and reverted to state control; concurrently, Federal recognition withdrawn from Battery B, 899th Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion (NGUS)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 June 1959 as Battery B, 3d Automatic Weapons Battalion, 213th Artillery

Converted and redesignated 17 February 1968 as the 3622d Heavy Equipment Maintenance Company

Consolidated 1 April 1974 with Detachment 1, 3622d Heavy Equipment Maintenance Company (see ANNEX 1), and consolidated unit designated as the 3622d Heavy Equipment Maintenance Company

Redesignated 1 April 1975 as the 3622d Maintenance Company

Consolidated 1 January 2000 with Detachment 1, 3622d Maintenance Company (see ANNEX 2); consolidated unit designated as the 3622d Maintenance Company, and location changed to Annville

### **ANNEX 1**

Organized and Federally recognized 1 May 1962 at Reading as the Service Battery, 4th Howitzer Battalion, 213th Artillery

Reorganized and redesignated 24 March 1964 as the Service Battery, 4th Battalion, 213th Artillery

Converted and redesignated 17 February 1968 as the Special Equipment Maintenance Platoon and the 1st and 2d Auto Maintenance Platoons, 3622d Heavy Equipment Maintenance Company

## **3622d MAINTENANCE COMPANY**

Reorganized and redesignated 15 January 1970 as Detachment 1, 3622d Heavy Equipment Maintenance Company

### **ANNEX 2**

Organized 1 March 1941 in Federal service at Annville as the Service Battery, 1st Battalion, 107th Field Artillery

Reorganized and redesignated 17 February 1942 as the Service Battery, 107th Field Artillery Battalion

Inactivated 25 July 1945 at Yvetot, France

Reorganized and Federally recognized 1 May 1947 as the 103d Ordnance Medium Maintenance Company

Consolidated 1 June 1959 with the 393d Signal Detachment (organized and Federally recognized 7 May 1956 at Annville), and consolidated unit designated as the 103d Ordnance Company

Redesignated 17 February 1968 as the 103d Heavy Equipment Maintenance Company

Redesignated 1 April 1975 as the 103d Maintenance Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1993 as Detachment 1, 3622d Maintenance Company
