Mustered into Federal service 26 June 1916; mustered out of Federal service 4 October 1916

Mustered into Federal service 4 April 1917; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 12 October 1917 as Company I, 131st Infantry, an element of the 33d Division

Demobilized 6 June 1919 at Camp Grant, Illinois

Redesignated 13 December 1921 as Company I, 131st Infantry, an element of the 33d Division (later redesignated as the 33d Infantry Division)

(131st Infantry relieved 23 March 1942 from assignment to the 33d Infantry Division)

Inactivated 26 February 1944 at Fort Benning, Georgia

(131st Infantry assigned 5 July 1946 to the 33d Infantry Division)

Reorganized and Federally recognized 15 December 1947 at Chicago

Consolidated 16 March 1959 with Headquarters Company, 3d Battalion, 131st Infantry (see ANNEX 1), and Company H, 131st Infantry (see ANNEX 2), and consolidated unit reorganized and redesignated as Company D, 1st Battle Group, 131st Infantry

Consolidated 1 April 1963 with Company E, 1st Battle Group, 131st Infantry (see ANNEXES 3, 4, and 5), the 733d Ordnance Battalion (see ANNEXES 6 and 7), and the 433d Transportation Detachment (organized and Federally recognized 18 May 1959 at Chicago); consolidated unit reorganized and redesignated as the 733d Maintenance Battalion and remained assigned to the 33d Infantry Division

Reduced, reorganized, and redesignated 1 February 1968 as Company D, 108th Support Battalion, an element of the 33d Infantry Brigade

Location changed 1 June 1987 to North Riverside

Redesignated 1 February 1989 as Company B, 108th Support Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1997 as the 3625th Maintenance Company and relieved from assignment to the 33d Infantry Brigade

Ordered into active Federal service 3 January 2004 at North Riverside; released from active Federal service 30 June 2005 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 12 October 1917 as Company M, 131st Infantry, an element of the 33d Division

Demobilized 6 June 1919 at Camp Grant, Illinois

Reorganized 30 June 1921 in the Illinois National Guard at Chicago as Company M, 1st Infantry

Redesignated 13 December 1921 as Company M, 131st Infantry, an element of the 33d Division (later redesignated as the 33d Infantry Division)

Inducted into Federal service 5 March 1941 at Chicago

(131st Infantry relieved 23 March 1942 from assignment to the 33d Infantry Division)

Inactivated 26 February 1944 at Fort Benning, Georgia

(131st Infantry assigned 5 July 1946 to the 33d Infantry Division)

Reorganized and Federally recognized 14 April 1947 at Chicago

Reorganized and Federally recognized 27 February 1947 at Chicago as the 733d Ordnance Medium Maintenance Company and assigned to the 33d Infantry Division

Consolidated 1 November 1952 with the 3625th Ordnance Medium Automotive Maintenance Company (see ANNEX 6); consolidated unit concurrently expanded, reorganized, and redesignated as the 733d Ordnance Battalion and remained assigned to the 33d Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1963 as the 733d Maintenance Battalion
