Lineage and Honors

694th MAINTENANCE COMPANY

Organized 15 November 1922 in the North Carolina National Guard at New Bern as Battery D, 117th Field Artillery, an element of the 39th Division

(117th Field Artillery relieved 1 July 1923 from assignment to the 39th Division and assigned to the 31st Division)

Reorganized and redesignated 12 January 1927 as Battery D, 113th Field Artillery, an element of the 30th Division

Inducted into Federal service 16 September 1940 at New Bern

Reorganized and redesignated 7 February 1942 as Battery D, 2d Battalion, 196th Field Artillery, and relieved from assignment to the 30th Division

Reorganized and redesignated 8 February 1943 as Battery A, 690th Field Artillery Battalion

Inactivated 29 October 1945 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey

Reorganized and Federally recognized 25 June 1947 in the North Carolina National Guard at New Bern as Headquarters Battery, 690th Field Artillery Battalion

Ordered into active Federal service 23 January 1951 at New Bern

(Headquarters Battery, 690th Field Artillery Battalion [NGUS], organized and Federally recognized 26 January 1953 at New Bern)

Released from active Federal service 4 April 1955 and reverted to state control; concurrently, Federal recognition withdrawn from Headquarters Battery, 690th Field Artillery Battalion (NGUS)

694th MAINTENANCE COMPANY

Reorganized and redesignated 10 March 1963 as Battery A, 4th Battalion, 113th Artillery, an element of the 30th Infantry Division

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 January 1968 as Company C, 167th Military Police Battalion

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 December 1971 as the 694th Maintenance Company

Ordered into active Federal service 6 September 2005 at New Bern; released from active Federal service 4 March 2007 and reverted to state control


