Constituted 23 March 1959 in the South Carolina Army National Guard as the 151st Signal Battalion and assigned to the 51st Infantry Division

Organized 1 April 1959 in central South Carolina from existing elements with Headquarters at Columbia

Relieved 1 April 1963 from assignment to the 51st Infantry Division

(Location of Headquarters changed 1 January 1968 to Newberry; on 1 July 1980 to Greenville)

Ordered into active Federal service 10 February 2003 at home stations; released from active Federal service 27 June 2004 and reverted to state control


