Constituted 26 March 1943 in the Army of the United States as the 295th Signal Company

Activated 3 April 1943 at Camp Bradford, Virginia

Reorganized and redesignated 11 November 1943 as the 295th Joint Assault Signal Company

Inactivated 10 October 1945 in the Philippine Islands

Redesignated 6 May 1947 as the 804th Joint Assault Signal Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 2 June 1947 at Pasadena, California

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 1 November 1948 at Pasadena, California

Redesignated 6 June 1950 as the 804th Signal Radio Company

Activated 2 July 1950 at Jersey City, New Jersey

Inactivated 6 May 1952 at Jersey City, New Jersey

Redesignated 16 March 1954 as the 804th Signal Company

Activated 1 May 1954 at New York, New York

Inactivated 1 February 1956 at New York, New York
